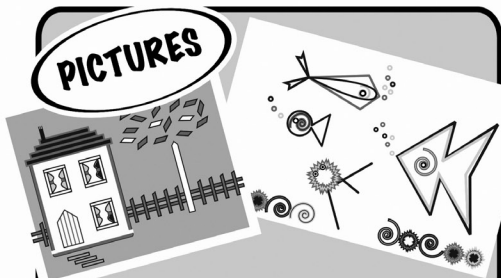
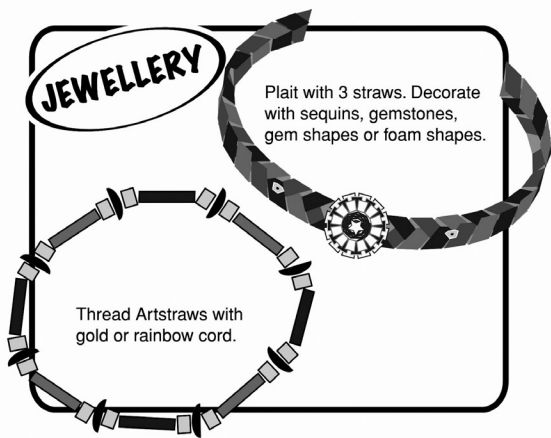


PICTURES



Use Artstraws with other materials (wiggle eyes, shredded foil, Art Roc, foam shapes, pipe cleaners etc) to create pictures and patterns.

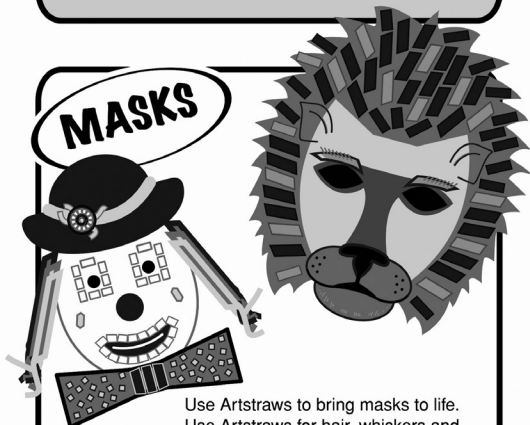
JEWELLERY



Plait with 3 straws. Decorate with sequins, gemstones, gem shapes or foam shapes.

Thread Artstraws with gold or rainbow cord.

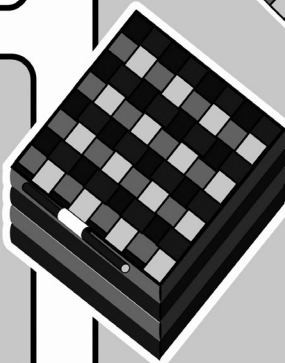
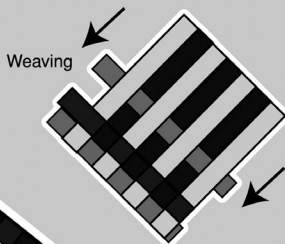
MASKS



Use Artstraws to bring masks to life. Use Artstraws for hair, whiskers and to create features.

CONTAINERS

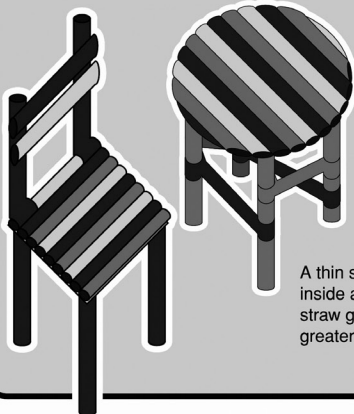
Cover cardboard or plastic containers with woven or plaited Artstraws. Decorate with more Artstraws, sequins, foam or wooden shapes.

FURNITURE

Stick Artstraws onto pieces of card to create the basic shape.

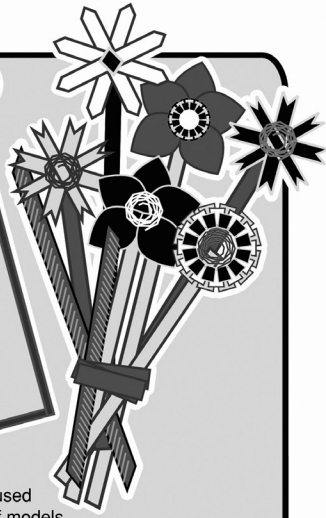


A thin straw inside a fat straw gives greater strength.

ARTSTRAWS

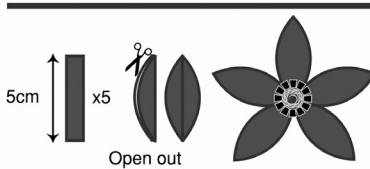
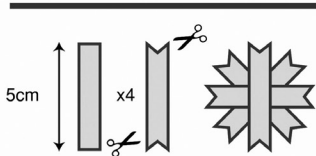
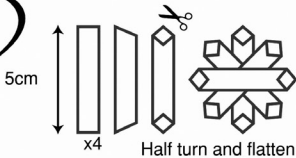
- Stick with white paper glue (PVA). It will dry clear
- Cut with scissors
- Use both thick and thin straws
- You can cut, stick, plait and weave the straws

FLOWERS

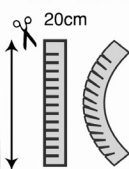


Flower heads can be used to decorate all kinds of models.

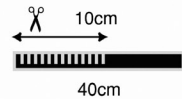

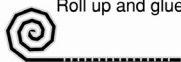
Flower Leaves



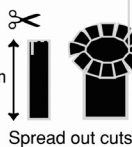
Flatten Artstraw



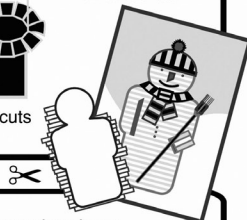
Start with uncut end

Spread out cuts

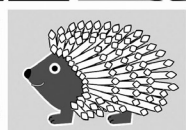
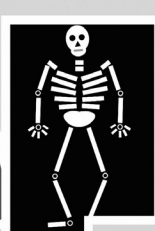


Flower Centre



CARDS

Draw the outline shape and stick on straws to give a 3D effect e.g. windows and tiles on a house, candles on a cake, whiskers on an animal.



Draw a snowman shape on paper and cut it out. Stick straws onto the shape so it is completely covered. When dry, turn the snowman over and cut round the shape to trim off the excess straws. Stick the snowman shape to a card, decorate with more Artstraws, wiggle eyes etc.
